Must have successfully completed, or will complete by the scholarship award date, at least four full semesters of study. Must be an undergraduate enrolled in a major curriculum of agriculture or natural resource conservation, including agronomy, soil science, plant science, forestry, geography, journalism, agricultural education, environmental science, wildlife or fisheries management, environmental engineering, and other areas related to conservation.

A special area of focus is on environmental awareness, such as preservation of the Pine Barrens ecosystem and Creek Farm, a sustainable chemical-free farm. Accepted majors include but are not limited to: agriculture, horticulture, ecology, landscape design, planning, environmental science, sustainability, and climate change.

American Meteorological Society Graduate Fellowship

- Fellowships are for graduate students entering their first year of graduate school and pursuing a degree in atmospheric or related sciences at a U.S. accredited institution. Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale and be a U.S. citizen or hold permanent resident status.

- Award: Nine-month stipend plus partial travel support to attend the AMS annual meeting.

Dr. Nancy Foster Scholarship Program

- Scholarships for independent graduate-level studies in oceanography, marine biology or maritime archaeology. Preference will be given to women and minority students; all eligible applicants must be U.S. citizens who are admitted to a relevant graduate program at an accredited institution.
- Award: Up \$42,000 yearly scholarship

Fulbright Foreign Student Program

- Fulbright offers several different grants, including ones for international students who wish to study in the United States each year. Qualified candidates must possess a first-or upper second-class honors bachelor's degree, be accepted at an accredited graduate school, display academic merit, pass the GRE or GMAT exam, and attach a curriculum vitae. Fulbright fellows must return to their home country for at least two years after funding.
- Award: Varies, stipend based on cost of living

Garden Club of America Fellowship in Ecological Restoration

- This grant is open to graduate students whose field of study can range from forestry and ecology to applied plant sciences and evolutionary biology. Eligible candidates must be enrolled in a leading accredited U.S. institution in environmental sciences and be engaged in research study in the recovery of ecological integrity.
- Deadline: December
- Award: Annual grant of \$8,000

PEO International Peace Scholarships

- Scholarships are awarded to women from outside the U.S. or Canada who are seeking their master's or PhD degrees in the United States or Canada. Eligible applicants must be enrolled full-time at an accredited college, not hold U.S. citizenship or be a permanent resident. Applicants will need to have a full year of coursework remaining, exhibit financial need and apply before starting their dissertation research.
- Award: Up to \$12,500

Recycling Education and Research Foundation National Scholarship

- Scholarship open to graduate students enrolled in programs that support the scrap processing or the recycling industry. Eligible applicants should be in applicable fields, which include mechanical engineering, material engineering, sustainability, industrial design and water management.
- Award: \$5,000

Theodore Gordon Flyfishers Founders Fund Scholarship

- Available to students who are studying an environmental field and will be entering their first or second year of graduate school at a member institution of the Environmental Consortium of Colleges and Universities. Eligible recipients must be U.S. citizens and possess a 3.5 GPA within an environmental concentration.
- Award: \$5,000
